TAKE DOWN NOTICE

In the event that you believe you have been defamed by content on this website, or are the owner of the copyright or trademark in any of the material on this website and do not consent to the use of your material in accordance with the terms and conditions of use of this website, please contact us providing the information requested below and we will withdraw your material from our website forthwith on receipt of your written objection and proof of ownership of the aforementioned material.

Upon receipt of appropriate notification as set forth herein, where we deem it appropriate, we will take down or disable access to the material that is claimed to be infringing. Please be aware that providing false or misleading information in the notification of claim may result in civil and/or criminal liability.

Your complaint will be acknowledged within 2 working days of receipt.

If you believe that you have been defamed, your written notification must include the following:

1. Your contact information including your name, postal address, telephone number, email address, and occupation if applicable;
2. Identification of the content and the location of the content (URL or website address including the page name) on this website that you believe is defamatory to you and state why you believe it is defamatory; where possible, cut and paste in your written notification all content that you believe is defamatory;
3. A statement as to why you believe the defamatory content is untrue and the extent that it is damaging to you; and
4. A good faith statement, submitted under the penalty of perjury, that the information provided by you in the notification is accurate and true.
